

# The Clackamas River

The Clackamas Watershed is one of the jewels of the metropolitan area. The Clackamas River is the drinking water source for over 300,000 people in and around Clackamas County, and provides peace and solitude as well as extensive wildlife habitat.

The river is home to the **last significant run of wild late winter coho in the Columbia Basin, and one of only two remaining runs of spring Chinook in the Willamette Basin.** Recreation opportunities abound for our urban and rural communities - *so close and yet miles away!*




The Clackamas River Basin Council works with landowners, partner agencies, and local volunteers to keep the Clackamas clean and healthy.

- Our projects have **opened up miles of stream** once blocked to fish passage, repaired stream crossings, and enhanced streambeds for fish spawning and rearing for the benefit of surrounding communities.
- Our outreach and education programs are designed to connect people to place in our watershed. Volunteers engage in the **Down the River Clean Up** and **Stash the Trash** program, and plant native trees and shrubs at **volunteer work parties** throughout the year.
- We work with local partners to monitor the health of our watershed, including **water quality, stream biology, and channel characteristics.**

The Clackamas River Basin Council is dedicated to making our watershed a better place to live, work, and recreate.
